Prince Edward County

- 233 domestic violence investigations in 2022
- AFW provides services to 100 women a year
- AFW provided transitional housing to 14 women and 9 children within the last year

Provincial

- 52 femicides occurred in Ontario for 21-22
- 55 femicides have occurred in Ontario this past year

National

- Every 6 days a woman is killed due to intimate partner violence
- Rural women are 75% more likely to experience intimate partner violence




Women and Gender **Equality Canada**
